The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has reviewed conformity determination documents for the *Mobility 2050 Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP)* and the *FY 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)*, submitted by the Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (AAMPO) for interagency consultation and review. A conformity determination is necessary for the San Antonio, Texas 2015 8-hour ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) Serious nonattainment area due to the amended MTP and adoption of the new TIP, and the need to comply with the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act signed into law on November 15, 2021.

Any issues associated with the demonstration of conformity were addressed in conference calls and e-mails with the AAMPO, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Texas Division office, the Texas Department of Transportation, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, and the EPA. The criteria for our review and the interagency consultation process can be found at 40 CFR Part 93, Subpart A and guidance memoranda issued by the FHWA and the EPA for transportation conformity determinations.

Based on the information submitted to the EPA and discussed during the interagency consultation process, the estimated emissions of nitrogen oxides (NOx) and volatile organic compounds (VOC) for the Mobility 2050 MTP and 2025-2028 TIP will meet the conditions of the *build vs. no-build* and *less-than-baseline* tests for this analysis as per 40 CFR 93.119(b)(1). We have no further comments and are supportive of a positive conformity finding by the FHWA for the San Antonio area.
